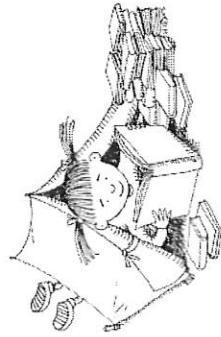

## Summer Math Enrichment Requirement

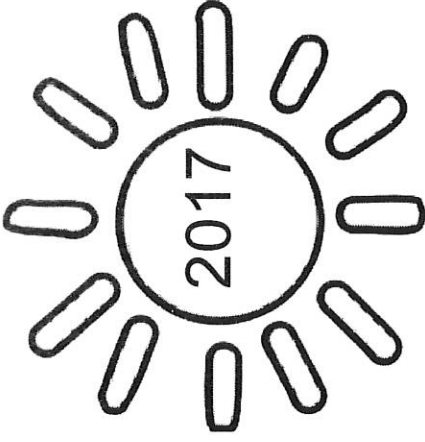
Your child has had a busy year learning new math skills. Mastery of these skills is extremely important in order to develop a solid math foundation. Next year's math program will add onto these skills so any time over the summer spent learning or reinforcing these concepts will be very beneficial for your child. Each year's math instruction builds upon the previous year's math skills.

Our summer requirement for math enrichment will be completed **through IXL**. You may access the login information for IXL through your child's current math teacher.

Your child will be required to complete, on average, **three IXL lessons per week**. Your child should choose **one lesson per letter subsection for the grade that they have just completed**. For example, your incoming second grade child may choose to complete any one first grade lesson from section A, any one first grade lesson from section B, and any one first grade lesson from section C during the first week of summer. **They will continue throughout the alphabet until they complete one lesson per letter up until the letter Z. By the end of the summer, you will have completed 26 lessons.**

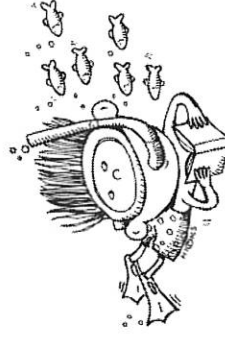
## Grade for Summer Math Enrichment Requirement

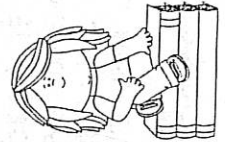
## Summer Reading Requirement

All students will be required to read this summer from our summer reading list and complete a journal for each book read.

K-2<sup>nd</sup>: Choose two books from the chart in this brochure.

3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>: Choose one picture book and one novel from the chart in this brochure. Novels have an asterisk (\*) next to them.

6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>: Choose one novel from the chart in this brochure.

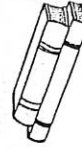


## Journal Requirement

After your child finishes reading a picture book, he or she will write a half-page to a page summary and reflection on the picture book.

After your child finishes reading each chapter in the novel, he or she will write a half-page to a page summary and reflection on each chapter of the novel.

- Students entering kindergarten or 1<sup>st</sup> grade may draw a picture to accompany any writing he or she can produce.
- The summary should include main events, key characters, and key details.
- The reflection should include likes, dislikes, and anything surprising to the child in the chapter or book.
- By the end of the summer, students should have a collection of entries that shows their thoughts on their reading throughout the summer. **The journal may be a notebook or a folder with paper.**

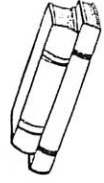


## Grade for Summer Reading Requirement
